What is iNSPiRe?

iNSPiRe is looking to tackle the problem of high-energy consumption by producing systemic renovation packages that can be applied to existing buildings. These packages aim to reduce the primary energy consumption of a building to lower than 50 kWh/m²/year. The project will last four years and is funded by the EC, involving 24 partners from the combined fields of research and development, industry, small business and not-for-profit organizations.
